### *Lessons from the Session*

**Communication That Connects** focuses on supporting new team members through structured check-ins using the IDEA Model and utilizing feedback to create a continuous conversation around skill and knowledge development.

**IDEA Model<sup>1</sup>** - The IDEA model is a structured approach to giving feedback that helps staff grow and improve.

- **I – Identify:** Be very specific about what your feedback is about (or the content) and the surrounding information (or the context).
- **D – Describe:** Fully explain the details, the what and why of your comment.
- **E – Encourage:** Take the time to offer help and support towards the desired change.
- **A – Action:** Determine next steps to take the feedback and implement changes towards improvement.

**Feedback Loops** - The feedback loop can be used to redirect behaviors. With practice it becomes more natural and effective, resulting in change and behavior improvement. The feedback loop begins with acknowledging a common mission and values. Then address areas for growth by providing objective information and the effect on the program along with a plan for support and improvement. The feedback loop closes with identifying strengths.
